Policy Corner - Weapons (Policy 9250)

The presence of weapons on school property poses a serious threat to the safety and well being of students and staff. It is unlawful for any person to carry or possess any rifle, gun, knife, or deadly weapon of any kind on any public school property in the state of Maryland. A weapon, as defined by school system policy, includes: any gun, dirk knife, bowie knife, switchblade knife, star knife, buck knife, hunting knife, throwing star, razor, metal knuckle, Nunchaku, explosive device, or any other object or implement intended to cause harm to another or used in such a way as to cause harm to another. Any student found in possession found in possession of a weapon on school property ill be suspended and the police notified. Possession of a gun, or any implement possessed under a circumstance that would reasonably lead a person to believe it was a gun, will result in expulsion.

Tips for School Success - Talk to Your Child Before Conferences

Ask your child if he/she has any questions or concerns they would like you to discuss with his/her teacher, and find out what strengths your child uses in the class. Let your child know what you plan to discuss with the teacher – when your child is involved in decisions about their education he/she is more likely to take responsibility for the work and performance.
