PARCC Assessment

Just a reminder that the new PARCC assessment is coming soon and your child will test on the following days in March:

March 2nd, 3rd & 10th 8th grade
March 4th, 5th & 10th 7th grade
March 6th, 9th and 10th 6th grade

It is essential that all students come to school on time on testing days. We ask that you schedule any appointments, outside of these testing dates.

Please encourage your child to eat a good breakfast on the days of the test, as well as get a good night's sleep before each testing day. Also, if your child wears eyeglasses or hearing aids, be sure that he/she comes to school with them during the days of testing. Testing can create mixed feelings in children. Please encourage your child to do their best and exude confidence during the test.

National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP)

We are pleased to notify you that Thomas Viaduct Middle School has been selected to represent schools across the nation by participating in the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP). First administered in 1969, NAEP is the largest nationally representative and continuing assessment of what students know and can do in various subject areas. It is administered by the National Center for Education Statistics, within the U.S. Department of Education. NAEP is different from state assessments because it provides a common measure of student achievement across the country. The results of NAEP are released as "The Nation's Report Card," which provides information about student achievement to educators, parents, policymakers, and the public. **TVMS's NAEP** assessment will be given on February 17.

Policy Corner

Civility (Policy 1000)

The Board has set clear expectations for civil behavior that supports a safe, welcoming, and nurturing environment on school property and at school-related activities.

Unacceptable behaviors include but are not limited to:

- Rude, insulting, or demeaning language and/or actions.
- Persistently unreasonable demands.
- Intrusive and/or interruptive behavior.
- Displays of temper.
- Harassment and intimidation.
- Threatening and/or abusive gestures and behavior.

Each individual is responsible for behaving in a civil manner and for cooperating in resolving incidents of uncivil behavior.

When resolution is not reached through cooperative agreement, either party involved may cite this policy and notify the other person that they are ending the conversation or the interaction and removing themselves from the situation by ending a phone call, walking out of the room, or requesting the other individual to leave the room.
