October 4th is Picture Day!

Reminder that Lifetouch Photography will be at TVMS to photograph students on Tuesday, October 4th. All students will need to be photographed for yearbook and administrative purposes, but only those submitting a completed order form to the photographer on picture day will receive a portrait package.

MAP Testing

As a reminder, all HCPSS middle schools are administering the Measures of Academic Progress (MAP®) assessment to provide information on student instructional skill levels and growth over time. In order to gauge progress, MAP will be administered at TVMS to all students in the fall, winter, and spring.

The fall administration schedule is as follows during the first 1½ hours of the school day:

- October 6 (MAP Reading) 6th & 8th Grade Only
- October 7 (MAP Math) 6th & 8th Grade Only
- October 10 (MAP Reading) 7th Grade Only
- October 11 (MAP Math) 7th Grade Only

We ask that you not schedule appointments during your child's test time to avoid having to take the student from classes for the make-up assessment. Please make sure your child gets a good night's rest, a good breakfast, and is ready to do their best on the day of testing!

HCPSS Family Emergency File Form - Please Complete

If you have not completed the Family Emergency File Form, we are asking you to make that a priority. The Family Emergency Form must be completed each school year. Even if your child's emergency contact is the same as last year, we need you to go into your child's account and either update or confirm his/her emergency information. Thank you to the families who have already updated/confirmed their child's emergency contact information in Family File.

Login to HCPSS Connect and select the Family File tab to review and, if needed, update your child's emergency contact, medical, arrival/departure information, and your preferences regarding data confidentiality. User guides for HCPSS Connect account activation and password reset, as well as Family File can be found in Guides.

NOTE: You must have a valid HCPSS Connect username and password to access the Family File. If parents/guardians forget their passwords, they can have HCPSS Connect email them a temporary password.

- 1. On the HCPSS Connect website, click the HCPSS Connect Login button.
- 2. Click the Parent/Guardian Forgot Password link.
- 3. Enter the email address used at the time of registration.
- 4. Click the Send Email button.
- 5. The parent/guardian will receive an email with a temporary password and a link to login.
- 6. The parent/guardian will click on that link and use the email address used at the time of registration and the temporary email to gain access.

Policy Corner

Bullying, Cyberbullying, Harassment, or Intimidation (Policy 1060)

The Board prohibits acts of bullying, cyberbullying, harassment, or intimidation because these behaviors compromise the learning environment and well-being of students, staff, and community. Bullying may include the following specific behaviors:

- · Hitting, kicking, shoving, spitting, hair pulling, or throwing something
- Getting another person to hit or harm the student
- Teasing, name-calling, critical remarks, or threatening, in person, by email, or text message
- Bullying by demeaning and making the target of jokes
- Rude and/or threatening gestures
- Intimidation, extortion or exploitation
- Spreading rumors or harmful gossip
- Cyberbullying
- Hazing

Students, parents, employees, and service providers are responsible for reporting violations of this policy that occur on school property, on a school bus, or at a school-sponsored activity or event off school property. Incidents of cyberbullying occurring from a student's home that impact another student's well-being at school may also be reported.

Tips for School Success

How to Talk About Bullying

Parents, school staff, and other caring adults have a role to play in preventing bullying. They can:

- **Help kids understand bullying.** Talk about what bullying is and how to stand up to it safely. Tell kids bullying is unacceptable. Make sure kids know how to get help.
- **Keep the lines of communication open.** Check in with kids often. Listen to them. Know their friends, ask about school, and understand their concerns.
- **Encourage kids to do what they love**. Special activities, interests, and hobbies can boost confidence, help kids make friends, and protect them from bullying behavior.
- Model how to treat others with kindness and respect.
