Canvas will allow students and parents to access course material, view upcoming assignments, and check grades for individual assignments. Synergy is the official grade book of record where parents and students can see class grades.

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#### **MAP Testing**

On Monday, September 28<sup>th</sup>, and Tuesday, September 29<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade students will complete reading and math MAP testing. We ask that you not schedule appointments, out of school visits, or other conflicts on testing days so as to limit the time your child misses classes to make up the assessment(s).

Please help your child receive a good breakfast on the days of the test as well as a good night's sleep before the test day. Also, if your child wears eyeglasses or hearing aids, be sure that he/she comes to school with them on the days of testing. We have asked all students to not bring electronic devices to the testing rooms. Encourage your child to feel relaxed and confident during the test.

#### **Interim Progress Reports**

First quarter progress reports will be sent home soon! HCPSS changed the date (for all schools), and the new date that progress reports will be sent home is on October 7. Most of your student's courses will have interim grades on progress reports like in previous years. However, semester courses that meet on "A Day/B Day" will not have a grade on interim progress reports but will receive their interim grades on the first quarter report card.

#### Naviance

Last week, Thomas Viaduct students participated in the first Naviance lesson of the school year. Each grade level focus was on the students' top three strengths from The Strengths Explorer's ten themes. The Strengths Explorer helps students identify and use their talents to achieve their goals and obtain levels of success. We want students to focus on "what is strong, rather than what is wrong." Students in 6<sup>th</sup> grade took The Strengths Explorer and discussed their thoughts and ideas upon hearing their results. Students in 7<sup>th</sup> grade used their top three strengths to create a "success card" describing how they will use their strengths to achieve goals in school. Students in 8<sup>th</sup> grade learned about high school information and described how they can use their top strengths to achieve their middle and high school goals.

While students will receive lessons and communication about Naviance and the Strengths themes throughout the school year, we encourage you to discuss this information at home with your child. To assist you, we will highlight each of the ten possible strengths' themes from the Strengths Explorer in the monthly newsletters.

We are currently holding a contest until October 30th to encourage you to log onto the Naviance program on the Thomas Viaduct Middle School website with your child. ### **Policy Corner**

#### Bullying, Cyberbullying, Harassment, or Intimidation (Policy 1060)

The Board prohibits acts of bullying, cyberbullying, harassment, or intimidation because these behaviors compromise the learning environment and well-being of students, staff, and community. Bullying may include the following specific behaviors:

- Hitting, kicking, shoving, spitting, hair pulling, or throwing something
- Getting another person to hit or harm the student
- Teasing, name-calling, critical remarks, or threatening, in person, by email, or text message
- Bullying by demeaning and making the target of jokes
- Rude and/or threatening gestures
- Intimidation, extortion or exploitation
- Spreading rumors or harmful gossip
- Cyberbullying
- Hazing

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Students, parents, employees, and service providers are responsible for reporting violations of this policy that occur on school property, on a school bus, or at a school-sponsored activity or event off school property. Incidents of cyberbullying occurring from a student's home that impact another student's well-being at school may also be reported.

## **Tips for School Success**

#### How to Talk About Bullying

Parents, school staff, and other caring adults have a role to play in preventing bullying. They can:

- **Help kids understand bullying.** Talk about what bullying is and how to stand up to it safely. Tell kids bullying is unacceptable. Make sure kids know how to get help.
- Keep the lines of communication open. Check in with kids often. Listen to them. Know their friends, ask about school, and understand their concerns.
- **Encourage kids to do what they love**. Special activities, interests, and hobbies can boost confidence, help kids make friends, and protect them from bullying behavior.
- Model how to treat others with kindness and respect.
