National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP)

We are pleased to notify you that Thomas Viaduct Middle School has been selected to represent schools across the nation by participating in the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP). First administered in 1969, NAEP is the largest nationally representative and continuing assessment of what students know and can do in various subject areas. It is administered by the National Center for Education Statistics, within the U.S. Department of Education. NAEP is different from state assessments because it provides a common measure of student achievement across the country. The results of NAEP are released as "The Nation's Report Card," which provides information about student achievement to educators, parents, policymakers, and the public. In our school, the NAEP assessment will be given on February 17.

Policy Corner

Student Assault and/or Battery on Staff (Policy 9270)

In order for learning to take place, the school environment must be safe and orderly. Therefore, any assault and/or battery by a student on a school staff member is strictly forbidden. An assault may be physical, oral, or written. Battery I is the unlawful touching of another person by the aggressor, and battery II involves unlawful touching plus a display of blatant disregard for the safety of the staff member or others. Consequences for an assault violation range from suspension to expulsion. A battery I violation results in suspension of up to 45 days. A first battery II offense results in a suspension of at least 45 days and may result in expulsion. A second battery II offense results in expulsion. A student who violates this policy is ineligible to participate in extracurricular activities for the duration of a suspension.

MAP Testing

As a reminder, all HCPSS Middle Schools are administering the Measures of Academic Progress (MAP®) Assessment to provide information on student instructional skill levels and growth over time. In order to gauge progress, MAP will be administered at TVMS to all students in the fall, winter, and spring.

The next portion of the winter administration schedule is as follows:

- 6th and 8th grade: Tuesday, January 20 (Reading)
- 7th grade: Wednesday,, January 21 (Reading)

Testing will occur during the first 2 hours of the school day. We ask that you try not to schedule appointments during your child's test time to avoid having to take them from classes to make up the assessment. Also, please make sure your son or daughter gets a good night's rest, breakfast, and is ready to do their best on the day of testing!

As a reminder, students who are enrolled in Algebra or Geometry will not participate in the math portion.
