Important - New Immunization Requirement

Effective the first day of school, 2015-2016, 1 dose of Tdap vaccine and 1 dose of Meningococcal vaccine will be required by the state of Maryland for <u>all students entering 7th Grade</u>. If we <u>DO</u> <u>NOT</u> receive proof of immunization, your child will be excluded from school.

Many students may have received these immunizations, but the Health Room may not have the **<u>updated</u>** immunization record. Please contact your child's doctor and send or fax an **<u>updated</u>** copy of your child's immunizations to the Health Room. Our fax # is (410) 712-6050.

8th Grade World Language Students

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In compliance with HCPSS Policy 8030, students taking high school courses in middle school may earn credit by passing the course and passing an exam that assesses student demonstration of locally established curricular objectives.

If students meet the above criteria, their grade will be recorded as a "pass" on their high school transcript.

Your student will be taking the End of Course Assessment for Middle School Spanish I in May/June. This assessment will consist of two parts. One will assess students in presentational speaking skills in the target language, and the other will assess presentational writing skills. The assessments will be scored on a proficiency rubric with which the students are familiar prior to practice and the final exam date. The target proficiency level for Middle School Spanish I is Novice Mid. Students must meet or exceed the target proficiency level in both parts to "pass" the assessment.

Students will be afforded the opportunity to take a practice assessment in April, which will prepare them for the format of the End of Course Assessment.

Congratulations in advance to your student for completing the middle school sequence of world language study, which is just the beginning of what will be a journey toward fluency in the language they have chosen to study.

Policy Corner

Students Charged with Community or Reportable Offenses (Policy 9280)

The presence in school of a student who has been charged with a reportable offense or an offense related to membership in a criminal gang may compromise the safety and well being of students and/or staff, and may disrupt the educational process in the school. Students who are considered by school administrators to have engaged in community offenses may raise similar concerns.

Maryland law requires law enforcement agencies to inform the superintendents of local school systems when a student has been charged with a reportable offense or an offense related to membership in a criminal gang. The information is then shared with the principal of the school the student attends, who conducts an investigation.

A student may be disciplined under this policy when the school system has evidence of the offense in addition to the notice of charges and when the student's presence in school raises concerns for the safety and well being of students and/ or staff or the order and general welfare of the school. If it is determined that the student poses no threat to the safety and well being of students and staff, no further action is necessary.
